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As a noun, "excellence" is the quality of being "excellent."



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"Everyday" means something as normal or commonplace. "Every day" means each day.



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"However" is a useful word that is often overused. In many cases, it need not be used at all, and should at least be replaced by alternatives.



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We use "even" to refer to something surprising, unexpected, unusual or extreme. The word "especially" fits better here, as it emphasizes the importance of one thing among others.



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As adjectives, the difference between "satisfied" and "satisfying" is that "satisfied" means being in a state of satisfaction while "satisfying" is something that satisfies.



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For formal speeches, scholarly papers, and the like, sentences should be re-written to avoid starting any sentence with such conjunctions as "however" and others.



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
